FIRE SEASON IS JUST AROUND THE CORNER

As this is the Year of the Volunteer, please help to protect our Volunteer Fire Fighters by installing your firebreaks before December 1, 2001. Firebreaks must be the correct width with no over hanging branches.

Permits are required for fires of any kind between October 1, 2001 and November 20, 2001 and between April 1, 2002 and May 31, 2002. The Prohibited Burning Period is from December 1, 2001 to March 31, 2002.

WHY RECYCLE?

Congratulations Cockburn residents on a massive turnaround in the amount of recyclables being diverted from landfill!

In the three months since introducing recycling bins, Cockburn has increased the weight of recyclables collected by 145% and reduced the weight of waste going to landfill by 21%.

Most Cockburn residents have embraced recycling enthusiastically, however some may still be asking the question, "why recycle?" In a word, we recycle for the future.

In the past, rubbish, was disposed of in the rubbish tip, whether it could be recycled or not. Now we are running out of space in the City's landfills and fewer landfills are planned for the future. In 1995 there were 11 landfills in Perth, by 2004 there will be only 5. Clearly we are facing a critical shortage of landfill in the metropolitan area. Capacity at most Perth landfills will be exhausted within 20 years! In the future we will have less space for dumping our rubbish. The solution is to decrease the amount of waste we dispose of at landfills by increasing the volume of materials we recycle.

The Cockburn community has achieved a great turnaround in their waste disposal habits. In the past three months there has been a 200 tonne per fortnight decrease in the waste being disposed of in the green bins and an increase of 115

tonne per fortnight in the weight of materials being collected for recycling! However there is always room for improvement.


It is important to place the correct materials in the yellow topped bin. The following materials are currently not recyclable and in effect, contaminate the other recyclables when being sorted at the Materials Recycling Facility (MRF). Polystyrene and foam packaging are NOT to be placed in the yellow topped bin. Green waste is also NOT to be placed in the yellow topped bin. Correct use of your recycling bin will increase the capacity of your green bin, leaving room for small garden cuttings, lawn clippings, foam packaging, etc. Remember green waste goes in the green topped bin. If you are unsure if a product is suitable for recycling please call the Customer Services Officer on 9449 3362.

By now you have noticed that rubbish collection rates have increased by \$24. This \$24 is necessary to fund the Regional Resource Recovery project. This 40 million dollar joint venture with five other councils in our region will provide the necessary infrastructure to process the bulk 80-90% of our domestic waste.

Whilst \$24 may seem a significant increase now, over the next 4 to 5 years other councils will experience a significant increase in their disposal costs as the pressure on scarce landfills continues to mount. Our costs, due to the Resource Recovery strategy adopted now, should be insulated from these future pressures.

Remember money is not the reason for recycling. We recycle for our future, our children's future, and our grandchildren's future.



The Guardians

The Beeliar Wetlands Heritage Trail has taken a big step forward in 2001 with the development of artworks along the trail. These artworks are located along the eastern side of Yangebup and Little Rush Lakes.

This project was made possible through funding from the Federation Community fund and the City of Cockburn and was officially opened by Mayor Stephen Lee on August 2, 2001 at the Mater Christi Primary School.

Four public artworks and a community art project were commissioned as a part of this project. Project briefs were developed to encourage artists to consider the landscape, the history/heritage and the culture of the area and relate it back to Federation.

The artists selected successfully reflected this in their work as follows:

"Timepoles," created by artist Chris Maple, reflects the intertwining of various cultures through growth and conflict in the Yangebup area.

"Waugal," totems created by Mick Councillor, are carved in a traditional manner and represent the Aboriginal dreamtime serpent the Waugal.

"The Guardians," three totems by local artist Sharyn Egan, use the layers of paint, colour and figures within to represent the ongoing custodianship of this place of the past, the present and the future.

Local artist Murrary Gibbs has created a seat with baskets based on the Chinese and European Market gardeners who cultivated Little Rush Lake at the turn of the last century

"Flock of Sheepish Grins" is a

humourous look at the sheep scouring industry. Artist Lesley King Dowding has created a flock of sheep seats decorated with colourful tiles made by students at Yangebup Primary School.

A recycled cement tank at Yangebup Lake has become a vibrant map looking at the different aspects of use and importance to the diverse community that has come in contact with the Lakes over time. Artists Melanie Evans, Claire Bailey and Nicky Stone with assistance from Toogarr Morrison worked with the year 7's at Mater Christi Primary School, students from Lakelands Senior High, seniors from Kwobarup and community members.

The Beeliar Wetlands have been the lifeblood of the Cockburn area and have a long and diverse history especially in and around the lakes.

These lakes have many areas of significance to the original custodians who used the lake system as a permanent water supply and food source.

Early land uses by the European settlement were principally for grazing of livestock and market gardening. The wool scouring operation on the eastern side of the Lake is probably the most significant industry in relation to the health of Yangebup Lake.

Today trails and public open space are a feature with people taking advantage of the natural beauty to recreate and enjoy this very significant area. Local community groups are taking up the challenge of assisting in the revegetation and future developments of the area and have taken ownership and pride in the ongoing rejuvenation of the lakes.

Here's how to in 4 simple steps:


Step 1 Contact your local police and get an Offence Report Number.
