If more than one candidate nomination is received all Cockburn electors on the Council electoral roll will receive election packages during the week commencing **Monday 9 February**.

On receipt of these packages please complete as required and return in the enclosed envelope. Please remember to sign the foil on the ballot paper envelope before placing it in the return envelope. No postage stamp is required.

Votes must be posted no later than Wednesday 4 March 2009. It is recommended that you mail your vote prior to this date to ensure arrival by election day.

Counting of votes received will commence shortly after 6:00pm on Thursday 5 March 2009 at the Council Chambers.



Disability information

Disability Reference Group

The City of Cockburn has a Disability Reference Group (DRG) that has been running for 12 years and is used as a model by other Councils. The reference group provides an opportunity for people with disabilities and their representatives to exchange information and communicate their concerns on access and inclusion issues. It also provides a forum for people to make recommendations to Council to improve the quality of life for people with disabilities. Membership consists of representatives from consumer and industry groups, Councillors and City of Cockburn. Membership of the Group is open to residents of Cockburn with disabilities; parents, carers, and advocates of people with disabilities; and people who work in the field of disability (voluntary or paid) in Cockburn. Hearing Loop

The City has installed a hearing loop in the Council chambers and adjacent committee rooms. The loops automatically transmit amplified speech directly to hearing aids to improve audibility for people with hearing impairments.

Interpreters

On request, the City can provide interpreters, including Auslan interpreters, for council business and events. Please provide prior notification if you need an interpreter.

The City provides regular publications (such as Soundings) in alternative formats. 2009 Grants, donations and sponsorship opportunities

APPLICATIONS NOW OPEN

Applications are now open for the following funding opportunities to support local groups, organisations and individuals for a wide variety of activities and services:

Community Grants assist local community groups and organisations to provide projects or activities that benefit residents of Cockburn. Applications are to a maximum of \$15,000, with smaller amounts encouraged.

Sustainable Events Grants assist local community groups and organisations in the provision of ongoing programs and activities for the benefit of the residents of Cockburn. The maximum grant provided to any one group will be \$7,000, over a four year period.

Donations are available to provide financial assistance towards the day-to-day running costs of not-for-profit groups, not for a specific project or activity. Donations are limited and highly competitive.

Sponsorship is a mutually beneficial partnership arrangement where the City of Cockburn makes a financial contribution to a group, organisation or individual for a specific purpose, project, activity or event and, in return, the City receives public recognition for its contribution. The maximum is \$20,000 for organisations and \$2,000 for individuals.

Cultural Grants support local arts and cultural activities. Applications to a maximum of \$4,000, with smaller amounts encouraged.

Youth Art Scholarships (under 18) are available for those who live in Cockburn and are either doing further study or travelling in relation to their art. These scholarships are to a maximum of \$500 to assist with fees, materials or travel costs.

Youth Art Scholarships

Anyone aged 18 or younger as of the application closing date is eligible to obtain a Youth Art Scholarship in either ONE of the following categories:

Trave

These are awarded to individuals who have been given the opportunity to study or perform within the arts arena interstate, overseas or outside the Perth metropolitan area. Individual Travel Scholarships will be up to \$500.00.

OR

Further Study

These scholarships are designed to assist young people with fees, materials or other costs associated with studying at a TAFE, University or specialist ART high school such as John Curtin SHS or some extra curricular activity they have been pursuing. Proof of enrolment/acceptance in a course will be required. Individual Further Study Scholarships will be up to \$500.00

These scholarships will be assessed on a monthly basis.
