mayor's message

We know now more than ever before the importance of conserving our water for the future. Now that Summer is upon us I would like to share some tips on becoming more waterwise.

Residential growth is creating a higher demand for water so it is important that we all try and do as much as possible to conserve this precious resource.

As a council, we have made changes to our irrigation systems and have implemented

a Water Conservation Strategy, where some 7.4 million litres of groundwater per day will be intercepted at Port Coogee and reused.

There are so many things households can do to help save water, however one of the biggest water wasters is our gardens.

Here are a few tips to help you become more waterwise in the garden:

- Keep to your sprinkler days.
- Use mulch around your garden to reduce evaporation.
- Don't cut the grass too often. Longer grass reduces evaporation.
- Plant more natives and other drought tolerant plants, which don't require a lot of watering.
- Use a soil wetting agent to enable your soil to absorb and retain more water.
- Adjust your sprinklers so they don't waste water by spraying on footpaths, driveways and streets.

By saving water you can also save money. Check out the Water Corporation's website to find out what rebates are available when you purchase anything from washing machines to soil wetting products and tap timers.

online building wins!

City of Cockburn, Swan, Wanneroo, Rockingham and Stirling councils have joined forces to develop an advanced information system that allows building licences to be lodged electronically by builders.

The Building Application Lodgement Integration Project Group (BALIP) won an award from the Home Building Society for its efforts in introducing the electronic lodgement of building applications from building companies. The Home Building Society 2007 Achievement Awards are a special way of recognising excellence provided to the Western Australian community by workers throughout the public sector.

Cockburn CEO Stephen Cain said the BALIP has revolutionised the way the building industry is able to raise, submit and have processed, building licences.

"An application that once took around 28 days to manually process, is now being turned around in less than 15 days through electronic means," he said.



"Everyone, especially homebuilders and renovators will benefit from reduced administration and processing expenses: another way Cockburn is implementing more sustainable work practices," said Mr Cain.

mosquito monitoring programme

The City's Health Services has commenced its mosquito-monitoring programme early this season in response to higher than usual mosquito numbers. Trapping and species identification started mid September and will continue on a monthly basis throughout the summer months, finishing in late March. Traps are set in key breeding locations around the City's six major lakes and wetlands, with additional traps being set in identified nuisance areas

You can assist Council in this programme by:

Preventing breeding around your house;

Mosquitoes require stagnant water to breed. Identify and remove all stagnant water sources (e.g. pot plants, any blocked guttering, etc.);

Prevent access of adult mosquitoes to septic tanks by:

- making sure lids are sealed on septic tanks, soak wells and leach drains;
- providing an insect proof cowl to the top of your educt vent pipe;
- ensuring your vent pipe is maintained in good condition (i.e., no holes due to corrosion);
- Check your garden for containers that could hold water such as jars, bottles, tins, plastic packs, old tyres, pots, etc.;
- Remove debris from roof gutters and downpipes;
- Avoid exposure at dusk and early evenings;
- Wear loose fitting long clothing outdoors.

poverty week 2007

The City's Atwell and Coolbellup Financial and Family Counselling services acknowledged International Poverty Week, which was from the 15 – 19 October. The Services held a health information day on the 17 October to raise awareness on the effects poverty can have on people's health.

With the focus on health, information was provided on a variety of issues such as regular checkups, diabetes, cancer and general well being. Those who attended received a tote bag that included hats, sunscreen, sunglasses, towels, contact information and more. Kids and families enjoyed the entertainment with bouncy castle, pony rides, face painting and free sausage sizzle.

Both Financial Counselling Services continue to work towards new strategies to assist homeless clients in any and all viable ways. One such strategy is our 'BBQ with a blanket day' run three times each winter to give out free blankets to those who would otherwise be unable to purchase blankets for the cold winter months.

sustainability update

Each year the City of Cockburn allocates a considerable amount of its budget to managing and improving the environment. We have extensive waste recycling operations, bushland revegetation programmes, adopted water conservation initiatives and more recently started using renewable energy.


More than 80 people attended workshops in September from across the City including City staff, Councillors, schools, sporting clubs, community groups, businesses, residents and other government organisations.

The workshops discussed sustainability, climate change, social responsibility and recycling.

Feedback and questions raised included:

- What can be achieved in terms of sustainability, climate change, social responsibility and setting clear targets.
- Lead by example, illustrate and communicate targets achieved.
- Promote the City's established recycling & waste management credentials.
- Consult widely and provide feedback on consultation.
- Become a lobbyist for change on climate change.
- Develop partnerships.
- Place a higher priority on education programmes with schools and community groups to spread the word on issues like urban design, sustainable planning and involvement in social responsibility activities.
- Development of an eco brand mark to represent targets and strategies of the City of Cockburn.

The City is conscious of the need to develop and implement a comprehensive communication strategy that will help us spread the message and achieve community ownership of this vital issue as well as identify other areas for leadership and environmental improvement.





let's talk recycling so what goes where?

Green Bin

The Green bin is **emptied weekly**. This bin is for all kitchen waste, general household waste and small garden waste such as lawn clippings and small prunings.

Under the Regional Resource Recovery strategy, not only will dry materials such as glass, paper, metals and plastics be recycled, but organic household waste will also be recovered as a valuable resource in the form of a high quality compost, suitable for use in agriculture.

Place your bins out on your verge by 6am on the morning of collection.

In order to avoid contamination of the compost, it is important that the following items are **not** placed in the green bin:

- No glass of any sort
- No car batteries
- No construction, demolition or earth materials
- No hazardous household waste
- No hot ashes

Yellow Top Bin

The yellow-topped bin is a commingled recycling bin which means that ALL dry recyclables can simply be placed, loose, into the same bin, making it easy to recycle more. The yellow-topped bin is **emptied fortnightly** on the same day as the green bin.

The following items should be put into the yellow-topped bin:

- Glass bottles, jars and containers
- All plastic containers: This includes all cool drink, juice, milk bottles, and plastic containers
- Aluminium cans and foil
- Steel cans (Food and pet food containers and empty paint cans)
- Aerosol cans (These are fully recyclable and DO NOT present a hazard during collection and sorting)
- Liquid paperboard (Fruit juice and dairy cartons and long-life product packaging)
- Paper and cardboard (all newspapers, all thicknesses of cardboard, cereal boxes, office paper and glossy magazines
