The Cockburn Community Liaison Security Service is supported by the local Police. Community Liaison Security Service officers will liaise regularly with Police on matters requiring law enforcement or other Police

The Cockburn Community Liaison Security Service started patrolling the City on December 1, 2004. The service operates 24 hours per day 7 days per week all year round. The highly visible patrol cars, pictured here with Mayor Lee, the Cockburn City Councillors, and CEO Stephen Cain, patrol every street in the district each day. These fully equipped vehicles will enhance the attention. The service will report all suspicious matters to the Police or any other appropriate agency.

When Community Liaison Security Service officers attend matters requiring the involvement of other City of Cockburn staff, these matters will be reported quickly to the appropriate Council Department for attention.

For over 25 years I have been a resident of Cockburn's West Ward. My wife Debra, two daughters and I originally lived in Spearwood but have now been residents of Coogee for the past 15 years. It has been my honour to represent the people of Hamilton Hill, Spearwood and Coogee for the last 4 years as one of your West Ward Councillors.

I firmly believe this is a most exciting time for our lovely coastline in Cockburn.

The future of our Coogee Coast has long been of interest to me, and motivated me to join the Coogee Beach Progress Association in 1989, eventually becoming president in 1992 a position I held for some 10 years. Even on my election to council, I continued my involvement with the Progress Association and I currently still serve as their Secretary. I also served as a community representative on the State Government's Coogee Master Plan committee.

Today would have to be the most dynamic time our Coogee coast has seen, with the promise of so many positive changes which will benefit all the residents of Cockburn and the wider metropolitan community.

The State Government's vision for the Cockburn Coast, launched at the City of Cockburn earlier



this year, proposes a master plan for the whole

coast from South Beach in Fremantle south to the Woodman Point Regional Park. This is not a "rubber stamp" for coastal development, far from it. The plan allows for huge tracts of open space and bush land to be preserved in the Beeliar Regional Park and Woodman Point Regional Park. The plan improves beach access, and creates safe sheltered beaches. It integrates the South Beach eco village and Port Coogee marina developments into a coordinated plan for residential developments with retail space turning our coast from a blighted post industrial wasteland into a destination to be enjoyed by both locals and visitors.



Illegal Structures - What Do You Need a Building Application For? You must have approval from Council's Building Department before you:

Begin any proposed construction (even simple garden sheds); erect new front fences or rebuild old ones within the front setback; fill in or excavated a site for building works; build a retaining wall; Construct a swimming pool or spa; make alterations or additions to a strata title building.

Commencing building without a Building Licence from Council's Building Department is illegal and may subject you to prosecution.

Interactive Maps Available on Website

The City of Cockburn has released its Interactive Mapping Application on the Internet. This feature of the website allows the people to view a range of maps and use various tools to customise the display.

The City's Geographical Information Systems (GIS) Services Department, winner of the National Government Technology Productivity Gold Award, will be constantly updating and improving both systems for the benefit of all users.

The Interactive Mapping System can be accessed via the Council's new website at www.cockburn.wa.gov.au and clicking on the map of Cockburn icon. A small help screen will appear. Clicking again on the map icon will launch the Interactive Mapping System.

The following mapping information is available on the City's website:

Property: Displays basic property location such as address and lot number. Approximate calculated dimensions.(for legal purpose reference must be made to original survey/certificate or title

documents)

The user can perform searches for specific addresses (using street name, street no, and suburb), assessment no. or the locations of council and community buildings, which can be selected from a dropdown pick list.

Aerial Photography: Aerial photography from 2003 is currently available and the latest aerial photography will be released in December. Ratepayers can view their neighbourhood. Potential new residents can view suburbs and new subdivisions to consider the most suitable to them.

Contours: Displays ground level contours in 1 metre intervals. These are a guide only as the contours were established in 1993/94. New contours will be displayed as soon as they become available.

Dog Exercise Areas: This feature shows the location of designated dog exercise parks and beaches within the City of Cockburn. Sites can be searched via a drop down list of current areas. A legend is also available.

Parks and Recreation: The location of parklands, park

facilities and pathways is available with this feature. Areas can be selected from a drop down list. Facilities, such as playground equipment, shelters and toilets, available in the selected park are depicted using symbols for which there is a legend available.

Stormwater Drainage:

Displays the approximate location of stormwater drains. manholes, pipes and sumps. Catchments are displayed in different colours. This information can assist in locating outlets or sumps which in the case of a chemical spill could help to contain or avoid environmental damage. A legend for this module is available.

Structure Plans: Shows the current Structure Plans adopted by council.

Waste Collection: Information for the ratepayers and identifies what day their rubbish bins are collected.

Zoning TP Scheme 3: View the Town Planning Scheme 3 for a property.

SENIORS, LOOKING FOR ACTION?


Move over on the exercise paths - the sixty to eighty year olds will be moving in if medical researchers at The University of Western Australia can successfully lure them into their walking shoes with an offer of personal trainers.

A new research program at the University is searching for the key to keep elderly people active. The team led by Dr Kay Cox from the UWA School of Medicine and Pharmacology is offering free exercise plans and testing of fitness, body weight and blood pressure for sixty to eighty year olds.

"We really want to see which of two approaches will keep older people active in the long term, either an initial six month supervised walking program led by a trainer or detailed and appropriate advice about exercise," says Dr Cox.

All the exercise programs and activities will be designed specifically to suit participants and a trained leader and age matched mentors will support the walking group.

"We will focus on the needs of the age

group so that the level of physical activity is safe and appropriate to each 60-80 year old man or woman," said Dr Cox.

The UWA team is looking for 60 - 80 year olds who want to become more active to improve their health and who are nonsmokers not currently involved in a regular exercise program.

The UWA research in conjunction with the City of Cockburn will be conducted at the South Lake Leisure Centre. The research will also provide to trainers and health promoters a training package on physical activity for the elderly, to contribute to health promotion in the community.

"We believe it is important that at the end of our studies we leave the community with a well designed and appropriately evaluated practical physical activity promotion package aimed at a group which has been under resourced in the past," Dr Cox concluded

SUMMER IS HERE ...

... CRANK UP THE BARBIE, BUT DON'T CRANK UP THE SOUND SYSTEM

One of the many services provided by the City of Cockburn's Health Service is provision of advice and guidance on issues of noise matters in the community. The City's Health Service can advise residents of the requirements of the *Environmental Protection Act* 1986 and the *Environmental Protection (Noise) Regulations* 1997 to ensure that they will not fall foul of the law and are aware of their rights and responsibilities.

Noise from activities on a property must comply with the (assigned) levels set by the above Regulations. In general, these levels are highest during the daytime hours (7am - 7pm), drop for the hours between 7pm and 10pm, and are the lowest from 10pm to 7am (9am on Sundays and Public Holidays).

If music and/or voices from activities being carried out on your

property can be heard at the boundary of the lot, this roughly indicates that the assigned levels are being exceeded. Be aware that bass components of music can be disturbing even when it doesn't appear to be loud. Bass components should therefore be kept to a minimum where possible.

It is important to talk to neighbours. If they are creating noise – make them aware of any concerns. When planning a party, inform neighbours and invite them to make contact during the event if the noise levels become excessive. Generally music should be turned down at 10pm and off at midnight. Encourage guests to leave the party quietly, without slamming car doors or screeching car tyres.




