VEHICLE BREAK-INS ON THE RISE



Vehicle break-ins are on the rise. Your vehicle becomes a target when items such as: iPods, tablets/laptops, GPS systems and bags are left unattended and visible to offenders, even through a secure door or window.

Contactless payment technology, such as PayPass/PayWave, makes it easier for thieves to steal and use credit cards. Marking your valuables with a UV pen, engraver or other methods such as DataDot, and storing relevant model numbers and specific information on a property register, will assist the Police and your insurance company in identifying and recovering your property if stolen. This register and other crime prevention tips can be downloaded from the WA Police website:

communitysafety.police.wa.gov.au

Report all vehicle break-ins to Police no matter how trivial. The information you provide might be the piece of the puzzle that assists them in apprehending the offender and reducing localised crime.

Below is a quick quiz created by WA Police to identify what your risk is of being subject to a vehicle break-in, but the message is simple... leave nothing in your car worth stealing. DO you...

- Keep cash or coins in your car? YES/NO
- Leave your GPS cradle and/or suction cup when you remove your GPS? YES/NO
- Leave your mobile phone in the car? YES/NO
- Leave property in your car which is visible to persons outside your vehicle? YES/NO
- Leave your vehicle unlocked? YES/NO
- Leave your detachable stereo system in your vehicle? YES/NO
- Leave your keys in your car? YES/NO

If you answered yes to one or more of these questions, you have an increased risk of your vehicle being targeted.

Get your free health screening (run by Co-Health and Curtin University) at both the Coogee Beach Festival and Harvest Hoo Haa events! Stop smoking with the Cancer Council's Fresh Start program in time for World No Tobacco Day on 31 May.

You can also learn to balance your diet and your budget with the FoodCent\$ program with Red Cross, lose weight, get fit, prevent or manage type two diabetes with the ever popular 8-week HEAL program. HEAL, supported by Fremantle Medicare Local, is free for people not in the full time work force and is offered at three venues across the city.

People who work can enrol in the flexible BEAT IT program at South Lake Leisure Centre. The long awaited HEAL maintenance program is now available for HEAL graduates at Cockburn Youth Centre.

Activities at the Cockburn Health and Community facility in Success include memory clinics, immunisation advice and mental health promotion. Walking groups are run by volunteer walk organisers throughout the City of Cockburn.

Fishing waste bins are helping to reduce fishing line entanglements impacting on dolphins, pelicans and other wildlife in Cockburn Sound.

The City of Cockburn has recently installed two 'Reel it In' bins at key fishing locations within the City. The 'Reel it In' bin campaign encourages people to place fishing line and tackle in the bins rather than discarding it on jetties and groynes.

The program was initiated by the Swan River Trust but has been expanded into the wider marine environment.

The bins will collect bait bags, lures, sinkers, hooks, floats and tackle packaging.

The City hopes that these bins will help reduce waste items from entering our pristine marine environment. It is well recorded that fishing lines pose a real threat to wildlife through entanglement which results in starvation or injury and in some cases, death.

The bins are already showing signs of being well used by the public.

In 2013, the State Government proposed to split the City of Cockburn into three. One day after that announcement, 85 Cockburn community group leaders met to discuss the situation. From this meeting, the CKCSG was formed. 17 Members of this group worked tirelessly, volunteering hundreds of hours each to collect over 12,000 signatures to support their 99 page proposal to the Local Government Advisory Board which resulted in Cockburn being retained.

Cockburn Central Activity Centre Plan

The City of Cockburn recently adopted the Cockburn Central Activity Centre Plan, with a goal of seeing Cockburn Central become the most influential activity centre in the south metropolitan region. This is the culmination of work over the past year, which has included community engagement to help inform the vision and highest level priorities recommended by the Plan.

The City has already begun the task of actioning the items from the plan. Work has begun on an Activity Centre Structure Plan that will aim to bridge the gaps in the planning of the centre and try and remove the impediments to growth. The Structure Plan will look to provide consistent planning for buildings, walking, cycling and public transport movements through the centre. The Structure Plan will also function as a launch pad for a number of other important long term items in the Activity Centre Plan.

Coolbellup Rezoning's – Scheme Amendment 105

The final stage of the Coolbellup rezoning process is now underway. Council, at the Ordinary Meeting of Council on 12 February 2015, adopted Scheme Amendment No. 105 of which is the mechanism to implement the rezoning's identified in the Coolbellup Revitalisation Strategy. Almost 140 submissions were received regarding the proposal, with the minutes available for viewing at cockburn.wa.gov.au/minutes

Following Councils support, Scheme Amendment No. 105 has now been referred to the Western Australian Planning Commission (WAPC) for the final decision of the Minister for Planning. The WAPC will review the proposal and pending final approval the proposal will be gazetted at which time the residential coding changes will come into effect.

The parade will proceed into Spearwood Avenue for the Youth Service at the RSL Memorial Park at 10.10am.

Her Excellency the Honourable Kerry Sanderson AO, Governor of WA, will address the assembly. Parents and community members are welcome to attend.

ANZAC Day Centenary Dawn Service Saturday 25 April 2015

5.30am - The Dawn Service will commence with the stand down of the Bibra Lake Scout Group - Night Vigil.

5.45am - The Catafalque Party from HMAS Stirling will march on to the sound of a Didgeridoo. The service will include a wreath laying ceremony. All community members are invited to lay a wreath if they wish to do so.

NOTE: Partial road closures are in place from 5.30am and there is limited seating for attendees.

A 'gunfire' breakfast will be provided for the community at the conclusion of the service.

ANZAC Day Centenary Parade and Service Saturday 25 April 2015

10.00am – The Parade will step off and proceed along Forrest Road and Carrington Street to the Memorial Hall Monument. COMMUNITY VOTES TO KEEP COCKBURN UNITED!

The rollercoaster of the State Government's Local Government Reform has come to a stop. Thank you for having your say.

Over 83% of votes received during the recent referendum in Cockburn voted not to have an amalgamation with Kwinana. A similar result in the City of Kwinana led to the process being abandoned entirely by the State Government!

The City of Cockburn was due to undergo a State imposed amalgamation with the City of Kwinana and lose the suburbs of Hamilton Hill, Coolbellup, North Lake, North Coogee, Leeming and Jandakot City.

Cockburn will now remain whole!

The City is now calling on the State Government to refund the \$3 million spent since 2009 on progressing reform plans.

HISTORY WITH LEAH - WWI IN COCKBURN



Spearwood War Memorial, originally placed on Sussex St (in photo) in 1922 and moved to the Memorial Hall in the 1960s.



This image is from the Azelia Ley collection, titled 'Young man from the Thorsager family' dated c 1916. The family were market gardeners in Spearwood from the early 20th century.

By the end of World War I, 40 men and women from the Cockburn district had enlisted and travelled to the front. This was no small number for a sparse farming population of less than 1,000 people.

Send-off parties were held frequently at the Methodist Hall on Rockingham Road. Money and goods were collected from Coogee to Hamilton Hill to raise funds for the war effort, and the Red Cross held auctions in community halls.

German migrants living in Spearwood found their names suddenly prevented them from finding work. This was

despite that they had lived in the area for many years and in one case, had two sons killed on the front lines.

The war had a great impact on the industry of the growing Cockburn district. All work was halted on the planned Naval Base at Henderson, never to be resumed, and the freezing works at Robb Jetty were delayed by several years. The quarantine station at Woodman Point saw tragedy when returning troops brought the Spanish Flu back from Europe.

The names of the enlisted, and the soldiers killed in action, are listed on the War Memorial that now stands in front of Memorial Hall, Hamilton Hill.

Cockburn continues to blaze the trail in innovative and cost-saving solutions, with our new Aquatic Centre at Cockburn Central being heated through Geothermal technology.



Geothermal Heating, is the transfer of heat from underground, to heat

the water being circulated in the pools. This will be a closed circuit loop, so no water is actually taken from the ground, just the heat, through a heat exchanger. To achieve the right temperature, a bore will be drilled, to the depth of approximately 800m, to reach water that is naturally heated to around 40 degrees celsius.

Compared to the standard heating, the geothermal system will reduce operating costs by approximately \$500,000 p/a and our Greenhouse gas by 44% per annum. Geothermal heating is the most efficient system for heating all the pools in the new centre and will be one of the many sustainable and efficient features, creating huge operational savings, for the aquatic centre.
