



BEELIAR BOODJAR BOOKLET: INSIGHT INTO COCKBURN'S ABORIGINAL HISTORY



Did you know the Nyungar name for the City of Cockburn is Beeliar Boodjar? Or that Bibra Lake is called Walliabup in the Nyungar language?

A free 24-page booklet has been compiled as an introduction to Cockburn's rich and deep Aboriginal history, based on existing literature and oral history projects.

Beeliar are one of the clans of the Whadjuk group of Nyungar – with Beeliar Nyungar literally meaning "river people".

CITY LEADS ACTION ON CLIMATE CHANGE



The City of Cockburn has achieved a significant milestone in its climate change program by meeting its target to reduce emissions from electricity and fuel by more than 20% from 1996 levels.

The target was set over 10 years ago by Council and was achieved through investments in energy efficiency improvements, installation of solar photovoltaic systems, and the purchase of offsets and Greenpower. The City was also a winner at the 2011 National Awards for Local Government for leading community climate change action recently received an award by the WA Local Government Association for achieving 'Emissions Aware' status.

Moving forward the City has developed a Greenhouse Gas Emission Reduction Strategy and set new targets to continue its commitment to reduce greenhouse gas emissions.

A zero emissions fleet, photovoltaic's, wind turbines, and renewable energy policy are just some of the projects planned under the Strategy.

By 2050 the City will have reduced emissions by more than 60 per cent.




The \$6.5 million two-storey surf lifesaving club construction contract was awarded to Pindan Pty Ltd and includes community facilities, a gym, change rooms, meeting rooms, kitchen, public toilets and public kiosk.

Stage one of the project was funded by the Commonwealth Government with stage two funded by the City of Cockburn, the State Government and Lottery West.

The Coogee Beach Surf Lifesaving Club is due for completion in late 2012.

When all stages are complete, the facility will meet the needs of the local community and growing southern Perth regional population of more than 500,000 people.

Important changes to waste and recycling collections

Collection days for parts of Atwell, Beeliar, Bibra Lake, Cockburn Central, Henderson, North Lake, Success and Wattleup, are about to change.

Properties affected by the changes will receive a letter and a sticker on their bins in October. The accompanying map details the specific changes (see legend) and supersedes information previously provided in the 2010-11 Resource Recovery Recycling Bin Collection Map sent in July.

The changes are a result of existing and proposed residential growth across the City of Cockburn to maintain an efficient waste collection service.

As with the previous arrangement, yellow-topped recycling bins need to be put out weekly on the same day as the green-topped bin.

More bins for hire!

If you generate more waste and recyclable products than normal services allow for, the City of Cockburn has additional 240-litre bins available at affordable rates.

Various options are available:

- Green-topped bins: \$190 annual service charge; \$105 per 6 months.
- Yellow-topped bins: \$85 annual service charge;
 \$55 per 6 months.
