As we were all enjoying the Christmas season, community groups across Cockburn have been rallying to keep the community together.

As this edition of Cockburn Soundings went to print, a group of Community Leaders, strongly backed by thousands of residents and ratepayers were to take a proposal to the Local Government Advisory Board (LGAB). The proposal recommends uniting the cities of Cockburn and Kwinana, minus Leeming. The LGAB is the body that will decide the future of your City by making recommendations for future local government boundaries to the State Government in the first half of 2014.

Community groups are anxious about a scheme to delete Cockburn from the map, and to split Cockburn's facilities and services into three different council areas. The potentially affected groups include not-for-profit, sporting, environmental, cultural and historical groups.

The State Government's announcement on local government reform on Tuesday 12 November essentially seeks to carve up Cockburn and distribute its population and assets to neighbouring local governments. Our community is rightly outraged by their 'left field' decision. It was a decision made without consultation and at odds with

their announcement on 30 July 2013 that saw Cockburn amalgamating with Kwinana. In reaction to this shock announcement, a Cockburn Community Steering Group (representatives from community, sporting, cultural and other organisations) was established to put prepare and put forward a proposal to the Local Government Advisory Board (LGAB) articulating the community that is Cockburn. This was done in the latter part of November, including a rally at Parliament House where the State Government was sent a clear message; 'Hands off Cockburn". The LGAB is an independent body that will be reviewing each of the submissions presented to them and making subsequent recommendations to the Minister for Local Government and Communities on the shape of future local governments in the Perth metropolitan area. Current legislation allows the Minister to accept or reject the recommendations, however the Minister cannot alter the recommendation. Public submissions will be called by the LGAB early in 2014 and herein lays a further opportunity for each and every person and organisation to make a submission. I am comforted by the outpouring of support from across our community

to prevent Cockburn being carved up for the benefit of neighbouring local governments. We must maintain the focus on preventing Cockburn from being carved up. Keep up to date on what you can do through:

Our City has a strong financial position, a focus on strategic planning, a steadily increasing rate base and provides a comprehensive range of social and community services backed by committed staff and a strong volunteer base. These are the attributes needed by any progressive local government and one that will ensure Cockburn retains its position as a leader in local government in Australia. The continuation of the City's community infrastructure program will see the completion of the integrated health and community centre (including a new library) in June 2014 and work continuing on the proposed integrated regional aquatic and recreational centre at Cockburn Central West. A refurbishment program for existing facilities will continue to ensure the best possible resources are available for our community.

In closing, I thank the elected members, staff, volunteers and the Cockburn community for their contributions towards making Cockburn a place of destination, increasing importance and vibrancy in Western Australia. My best wishes for the festive season and a 2014 that realises your personal dreams and aspirations and those of your family.

#### What is this all about?

The WA Government unexpectedly announced the carving up of Cockburn to subsidize surrounding local governments by dividing the City's assets. Your valuable assets will not disappear, but they will belong to a different local government which means you and your community groups may not gain access to the facilities paid for with your rates! These assets include the City's buildings, parks, recreation centre, seniors centre and more which could potentially be sold off to pay the debts of the cities of Fremantle, Melville and Kwinana.



#### Proposal to improve our parks and reserves

At a recent ordinary council meeting the City's Council endorsed the proposed expenditure of almost \$1.5 million to upgrade various parks and reserves around the city with shade sails, exercise and playground equipment, lighting and shelter.

The proposals will be referred to the Western Australian Planning Commission for consideration and recommendation to the Minister for Planning and Infrastructure. If this is approved the City will then receive a report with the approved expenditure and delivery timeframes.

The proposed upgrades include public open space in the suburbs of Atwell, Munster, South Lake, Hamilton Hill, Beeliar, Aubin Grove, Jandakot and Hammond Park.

#### **COCKBURN PIONEERS MOSAIC MURAL**



Over the past 18 months a small group of volunteers led by mosaic artist Sarah Francis, have been designing and creating a mosaic mural at the Cockburn Seniors Centre.

The idea for the mural emerged from the classes that Sarah has been teaching at the Centre. For many people they had very little room to display work that they had produced in their own homes, so why not create a mural for the centre?

The theme came from listening to the stories of many of the participants who grew up in the Cockburn area.

The design evolved to include representations of the early European settlement of Cockburn and the social and economic activities in the area including the horse racing on CY O'Connor Beach, market gardens, Robbs Jetty, the lighthouse, fishing industries and the brick kiln. By using a diverse range of materials from hand painted tiles, local kap rock, broken crockery and decorative ceramics, the mosaic provides a three dimensional representation of part of Cockburn's history. The mosaic can be viewed at the Cockburn Senior Centre by December 2013.

# **INSPIRING ARTWORKS UNVEILED AT ELIZA PONDS**



The past and present were brought together in a stunning collection of giant artworks unveiled by Mayor Logan Howlett at a special art exhibition at the new Eliza Ponds estate in Spearwood during September.

The public artworks have been inspired by the former Watsonia factory site, which is being transformed into 350 home sites as part of the stunning Eliza Ponds community.

Destined for the parklands in the new residential estate, the six artworks were created by renowned Western Australian artist Ken Sealey after being commissioned by George Weston Foods, the current owners of the site.


Mr Sealey explains the public artworks celebrate the Watsonia site's rich 100-year history.

"My goal was to keep the history of the area alive for future generations, while also giving each work a modern feel," Mr Sealey said.

The artworks were unveiled at the launch function by William Watson's great-grandson, Greg Preston. Mr Watson was the founder of Watsonia and a significant local businessman, philanthropist and federal politician.

"It's incredible to see how these designs have been inspired by artifacts from the original factory," said Mr Preston. "It means a great deal to me and my family and we're very pleased they have been created for future generations to enjoy."

The six larger-than-life artworks will be positioned within the parklands of Eliza Ponds this summer.

#### **POOL SAFETY**



We are approaching the warmer weather so now is a good time to check that your home swimming pool meets the safety standards. You can download a copy of the Home Pool Safety Checklist at <a href="https://www.homepoolsafety.com.au">www.homepoolsafety.com.au</a> and ensure that your pool is safe this summer.

Some things to consider:

## **Swimming Pool Gates**

The gate of a pool fence is crucial in preventing a child's access. It is unfortunate that all too often pool gates are not secured properly and drowning does occur. A child does not need a great deal of strength to push open an unsecured gate. Gates must be:

- self-closing,
- self-latching,
- · must open outward from the pool,
- · latch must be more than 1.5m from the ground and
- must be self-closing and self-latching from all positions.

#### **Swimming Pool Fences**

Fencing is another essential layer of defence in drowning prevention. The fence acts as a barrier to the pool and as such, helps prevent access to the water by young children. In addition, pool fencing is a legal requirement in all States and Territories in Australia. Heavy penalties can be imposed for noncompliant pools. Swimming pool fences should be:

- Secure and in good working order
- No more than 100mm from the ground
- Pool fence should be at least 1.2m high
- Boundary fence should be at least 1.8m high
- No vertical gaps more than 100mm apart.

#### **RATES ROUND UP**



The 2013/2014 council rating year is well underway with the third payment instalment option falling due on 7 January 2014.

Those electing to pay by this option must ensure their payment is made by this date in order to avoid late payment penalty interest.

Direct Debit facilities are now available at Council for payment arrangements and forms can be obtained by downloading from our website or contacting the City by email, phone or the front counter. Customers who default on their original payment arrangement will be required to enter into a direct debit arrangement.

Please note that overdue accounts accrue daily penalty interest and could incur additional costs if legal proceedings are pursued.

Unfortunately, the City is not in a position to allow this matter to go unresolved indefinitely and it is in your best interests to contact Rates Services on 9411 3444 to discuss your payment options if you are experiencing financial difficulties.

# THE GREAT TOY UPGRADE @ ATWELL TOY LIBRARY




The Atwell Toy Library was successful in obtaining a Community Grant from the City of Cockburn in March 2013 to expand their variety of toys and replace older well-loved toys.

# **HISTORY WITH LEAH - THE SUBURB OF YANGEBUP**





The suburb we now know as Yangebup was not officially named and marked until 1977, but the name was in use throughout Cockburn's history. Believed to have originated from the Nyungar word yanget, a name for a local bullrush. it was first recorded in 1841 and went on to become the name of a lake and a major rural

road in the area. Settlers around Yangebup Lake came to think of themselves as Yangebup residents, building a community of farmers and gardeners in an area known statewide for its natural beauty.

Unfortunately, Yangebup Lake's beauty became a prime target for game hunters, with many local men spending their summer weekends shooting native birds. It was eventually declared a Native Game Reserve in the late 1920s, and anyone caught killing its wildlife faced hefty fines. In 1924 a local scientist discovered a new species of prehistoric crustacean living in the lake, supporting the new theory of a southern 'supercontinent'.

Yangebup Road was an important link between Fremantle and Jandakot, joining Forrest Road at Yangebup to connect everything with Armadale and beyond. Pioneer farmers fought long and hard for electricity and a railway to be run along it, but without success. Yangebup Road was realigned in the early 1990s and effectively became Beeliar Road.
