









Australian Prime Minister Kevin Rudd discussed local responses to the global financial crisis and the challenges of unemployment and training with members of the Cockburn community at a jobs forum held at the City of Cockburn during April.

The forum was co-hosted by Minister for Employment Participation Brendan O'Connor, Federal Member for Fremantle Melissa Parke, Federal Member for Brand Gary Gray and City of Cockburn Mayor Logan K Howlett.

About 200 representatives from local business groups, industry, education and training organisations joined those who are currently unemployed or in transitional vocational training to share their thoughts with the Prime Minister at the forum.

City of Cockburn Mayor Logan K Howlett welcomed Mr Rudd to Cockburn, the first time a Prime Minister had visited the City.

"The City of Cockburn, together with the South West Group, is committed to encouraging and supporting sustainable business and employment and training opportunities in our region."

"I thank the Prime Minister for taking the opportunity to speak directly with representatives within our community on the challenges for local small businesses, industry, education and training providers and community support groups to address unemployment, resulting from the effect of the global financial crisis and to hear the concerns of our unemployed."



Install energy saving light globes (\$5-\$10 ea)	\$80 (based on replacing five 100W with 20W lamps)	Very easy!	
Lower your hot water thermostat	\$120 on an electric storage unit if you turn it down from 70°C to 60°C	Quite easy and free! Most systems are adjustable	
Install a water saving shower head (\$20 - \$100)	\$70 - \$130 per year depending on hot water system	Quite easy- Thread it on where your old shower head was	
Switch off standby power on 5 appliances	\$35 - \$40 depending on appliances	Very to Quite easy- Switch off main button, use power boards with individual switches	
Install a solar hot water system with gas boost. Rebate available*.	\$340 -\$490 compared to gas or electric storage	Quite easy- Replace an older system when it fails or if you're renovating.

Impacts on birds include sickness, disease, food dependency, whilst impacts on wetlands and lakes include water pollution and algal blooms.

Tips to interact without interfering with birds include: bird watching; planting native gardens to bring birds to your garden and building bird baths!

Federal funding announced for Coogee Beach Surf Lifesaving Club

Two million dollars in funding has been pledged by the Federal Government towards the Regional Surf Life Saving Club to be built at Coogee Beach.

The funding will be contributed towards the \$9.9 million project involving the construction of a two storey surfactub facility and community building including a gym, changerooms, meeting rooms and kitchen. The project also includes major car park upgrades and the establishment of a beach access node at the Poore Grove site.

City of Cockburn Mayor Logan K Howlett said the City has worked with the Coogee Beach Surf Life Saving Club and had pledged funding towards the Club's much needed replacement facilities

"The City of Cockburn is delighted to receive this Federal Government funding, which will be added to the \$2.5 million funding committed by the City towards this state-of-the-art community facility."

Stage 1 of the project, valued at around \$3 million, will include site works and the establishment of the beach access node and could begin as early as September 2009. Further stages of the project are subject to additional fundraising applications, to be lodged with Lotteries West and the State Government's Community Sport and Regional Recreation Facilities Fund. These will be submitted during 2009.





Tapper Road lights open to the public



Following about three months of works, the intersection of Armadale Road and Tapper Road was officially reopened in April.

City of Cockburn Mayor Logan K Howlett joined Ben Lisle from Linc Property to declare the road open on April 28.

The intersection now boasts traffic lights in a bid to improve safety and accommodate access to the South Central commercial precinct.

Land Rates

Land rates are now long overdue so if anyone is still yet to pay their rates please do so as soon as possible.

With legal proceedings now underway for outstanding accounts, Ratepayers, who have not entered into a special payment arrangement, must finalise payments by 30th June, 2009.

Registered Concession Holders should also complete their payments by **mid June** to enable Council to claim the rebate on their behalf, as the last date to receive concessions is also 30th June, 2009.

To budget for the forthcoming annual land rates, Council anticipates the issue date for the 2009/10 rate notices to be mid July with the due date being mid August, 2009.
