



# Meet Jonathan – Marina and Coastal Engineering Officer

The City's coastal assets are a treasure trove of gems and include Coogee Beach, C.Y. O'Connor Beach, Ngarkal Beach and the Port Coogee Marina. Having all these treasures under our care requires a lot of work to maintain and enhance them for generations to come. Jonathan is one of the key people responsible for taking care of our coastline.

Jonathan is a civil engineer who specialises in coastal and marine works. It is a niche industry that is relatively small in Western Australia.

His role involves maintaining and developing the City's marina and coastal assets - things like jetties, pontoons and groynes. Jon is also responsible for beach works (erosion management), monitoring the coastline, and planning for the future.

"The best part of working for Cockburn is the ability to forwardplan and adapt responses to issues like climate change and increasing usage that impact our coast," he said.

"I really enjoy how proactive the City is in managing and protecting our coast.

We have a focus on best practice and initiating measures to sustainably manage our coastline. This means residents and visitors will be able to enjoy the coastline for many, many years to come."

#### C. Y. O'Connor Beach Erosion Protection Design

The City has recently completed the first phase of its community engagement as part of a project to develop long-term solutions to erosion at C. Y. O'Connor Beach. Persistent erosion has been affecting the beach for over 20 years, and will eventually result in the loss of dunes, assets and community access if not addressed.

The aim of the consultation was to understand how people use the beach and what they value. Feedback strongly supported addressing the erosion issues via the construction of erosion control structures if necessary, while maintaining the natural characteristics of the beach as much as possible.

Coastal engineers are now preparing concept designs for erosion control structures for the beach, which will be presented to the community for further feedback and comment in autumn 2020.

### Grants now open!

#### 2019 recipient - Ozfish Unlimited

One such recipient in 2019 was OzFish Unlimited. An alliance between the University of Western Australia and Cockburn Powerboat Club, OzFish Unlimited is dedicated to protecting and restoring our waterways after decades of degradation.

OzFish was awarded a Community Grant to help fund its Seeds for Snapper – Cockburn Seagrass Project. Held throughout November and December, the project recruited and trained community members collect and disperse seeds to rehabilitate seagrass plantations in Cockburn Sound. Seagrass meadows are important for many aquatic animals and fish, serving as food, cover from predators and spawning zones.
